#### **ATTENDANCE**

Attendance is very important for your child's academic success. Please have your child attend school regularly. School starts promptly at 8:10 a.m. daily. Excessive tardies will result in a detention after 5 tardies per trimester. When your child is absent from school, please call the school office on the date of the absence. We encourage you to make medical appointments after school hours, however, if your child is absent due to a medical appointment, please bring a note from the doctor upon your child's return to school. All absences will be recorded. A pattern of absences or excessive absences may get referred to a district or county level attendance review board.

# **Welcome to Chatom Elementary!**

Because we believe that ongoing communication between home and school is essential to a student's academic success, you will receive weekly informational flyers in green communication folders. "Green folders" are sent home with students on Tuesday and returned to school on Wednesday. Please use the green folder to send notes back to the school.

Being involved in school activities is one of the best ways to be engaged and show your children that school is important. We invite you to participate in school activities such as Parent Teacher Club (PTC), Family Literacy Nights, school advisory committees, parent conferences, volunteering in your child's classroom, chaperoning field trips and attending special events.

Regular and prompt attendance is critical to the academic success of your child. Students should attend school unless they have a fever over 99.5° or have been vomiting in the last 24 hours. Please schedule appointments after school hours. When students attend school regularly, they form lifelong habits that help them to be responsible and reliable adults.

School begins at 8:10. Students entering class late or leaving class early are disruptive to classroom instruction. Students are considered truant if they arrive 30 minutes or later. A student will receive a detention after five tardies in one trimester.
