PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

In 2014, the cutoff date for entry to kindergarten changed in California from December 2 to September 1. This was a positive change that brought California into alignment with other states. Prior to 2014, one quarter of every California kindergarten class was a year younger than other kindergarten students in the nation. As a result of this change, a new early learning choice was created to support young five-year-olds who do not meet the new age requirement, transitional kindergarten (TK).

Transitional kindergarten is the first year of a two-year kindergarten program. Students are eligible for TK if they turn five by December 2. However, through our Expanded TK program, other students may be eligible as well. TK is taught by a credentialed teacher and is designed to prepare students for kindergarten. The focus is on social and emotional development, but TK is academic, too. TK follows the same extended day schedule as kindergarten. TK may be a good choice for kindergarten age students who are not yet ready for the rigors of kindergarten.

To be ready for kindergarten, students should be comfortable holding a pencil, turning the pages of a book, and following simple directions and rules. Many students can write their name and most letters at the beginning of kindergarten. They can identify colors and basic shapes in their home language. Kindergarten students will go to first grade reading and writing 30 sight words and numbers to 20.

Choosing the best option for your child is about more than their birthdate. The recommendations of preschool teachers, parents, and kindergarten teachers will be important factors in kindergarten or TK placement. It would be my pleasure to meet to discuss our kindergarten programs further.
